Brunello di The 2017 Brunello di Montalcino is remarkably pretty, with a vivid display of wild Montalcino strawberries and a dusting of autumnal spices, hints of fresh ginger and chalk dust. It's juicy and fleshy upon entry, giving way to a potent wave of intense ripe wild berries, sweet spice and hints of licorice. This is only lightly structured, yet its tannins have an edginess that will require some cellaring to soften, as inner rose and violet tones slowly fade. This won't be the longest-lived rendition of La Torre's Brunello, but it will provide a lot of satisfaction after only a few years of mellowing.
